OYSTER SPAGHETTI CASSEROLE.

- 1 package spaghetti.
- 1 quart oysters.
- 2 tablespoons butter.
- 1 tablespoon flour.
- 1½ cups milk.
- 1 teaspoon salt.
- ¼ teaspoon pepper.
- Buttered bread crumbs.

Parboil the spaghetti for nine min-utes in 4 quarts rapidly boiling water into which one tablespoon salt has been added. Drain. Scald the oysters in their own liquor, reserving the liquor. Make a white sauce by melting the butter and blending in the flour and the milk. Add the salt and pepper and cook until the mix-ture thickens, then add the liquor. Into a well-buttered casserole put alternate layers of spaghetti and oysters, finishing with the spaghetti and garnishing with a few oysters. Pour the white sauce over this, cover with buttered crumbs and bake in a quick oven fifteen minutes. Scal-lops or clams may be substituted for the oysters.
