Former G. A. R. Officer Dies.  
Cincinnati, Ohio, Jan. 1 (A.P.)—The Rev. Charles W. Blodgett, 85, retired Methodist Episcopal clergyman and former national patriotic instructor and chaplain-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, died here today.
