Co-operating with KHJ, election returns will be broadcast from the Tower of The Times intermittently tonight, the first figures to be given at 7:40 p.m. It is anticipated that a dependable summary of the result may be heard at 10:05 p.m. following the regular world-wide news item period at 10 a.m.

The schedule of election returns is as follows: Each period being for five minutes' duration: 7:40, 9:30, 10:05, 10:45 and 11:30, although the latter may not be necessary.

The bulletins will be in the nature of summary reports rather than precinct tabulations.

Wednesday is a day off but late sleepers may like to know that at 6:15 a.m. over KECA an attempt will be made

to rebroadcast the opening of the International Colonial and Overseas Exposition in Paris, France. President Doumergue is to speak and a French band will offer "La Marseillaise" and the national anthems of countries participating.
