Personalities, plays and concerts are to be offered by radio tonight. From Washington, over KHJ at 6:15 p.m., Amos W. W. Woodcock, director of prohibition, will tell of plans for a new brand of agent activity. A drive on violators of the Eighteenth Amendment is set for the 15th inst. He will discuss his program and what it may mean to the liquor traffic in the United States.

Another hat is to be tossed into the radio ring for the intercity radio championship when Eagle Rock presents its Woman's Club in competition over KHJ at 7 p.m. Lawrence Wilson, tenor, is the featured soloist. A skit portraying "The Legend of the Rock," the story of Eagle Rock, will be given by an especially trained cast.

Another feature that will tempt your dial is the presentation of thirty-five complete bands, totaling 1500 musicians, playing a group of marches in the Elks massed-band concert. This will be heard over KECA at 1. The bands are assembled for the annual B.P.O.E. convention. The program is to include several John Philip Sousa marches. "The Star Spangled Banner," "Auld Lang Syne" and other favorite selections.

At 3 o'clock this afternoon NBC is to salute Venezuela and Simon Bolivar, over KECA. Senor Don Pedro Rincones, Venezuelan Consul-General at New York, will speak; Justin Elle, composer, will direct a native orchestra and chorus in a program of Venezuelan music, with Jose Moriche, tenor, as soloist. This program is to be transmitted by short wave to South American countries for rebroadcasting.
