Concert lovers will hail tonight  
with interest when they learn that  
it is to mark the advent of a new  
series of summer evening sym-  
phonic programs, with the New  
York Philharmonic Symphony Or-  
chestra playing.

The Columbia Broadcasting Sys-  
tem through KHJ at 6 o'clock of-  
fers this new series. KHJ will  
broadcast three of the programs  
each week, on Thursday and Fri-  
day from 6 to 6:30 p.m. and Sat-  
urdays from 5:30 to 6 p.m.

The three conductors for this  
series are William Van Hoogstraten,  
Fritz Reiner and Albert Coates.  
Van Hoogstraten is to have charge  
of the first three weeks' concerts.  
This evening Chabrier's rhapsody  
"España," and Tschalkowsky's  
"1812 Overture" will be featured.

Three other concerts this evening  
help comprise a foursome of music  
and song that few listeners will  
ignore.

Turning back to 5:30 this after-  
noon, KECA promises a half-hour  
from the East, offering Countess  
Olga Albani in song recital. Her  
feature song will be Jascha Heifetz's  
own arrangement of the beautiful  
"Estrellita." The program will re-  
fect the air of a Spanish fiesta in  
honor of the featured singer.

At 7:30 over KFI the Standard  
Symphony Orchestra, under the  
baton of Mischel Plastro, will dedi-  
cate its musical hour to Lord  
Byron. Music particularly suited  
to depicting the life and works of  
the great English poet will be fea-  
tured, beginning with Schumann's  
"Manfred" and including the music  
of the Piedmontese Dances of Sini-  
gaglia to picture Byron's days in  
Italy.

## SALUTE TO SPAIN

Spain again will be saluted over  
KHJ at 8:30, when another Ingle-

wood Park memorial concert will  
provide thirty minutes of all-Spanish  
selections by Frederick Stark  
his orchestra and ensemble. Claire  
Van Nostrand will be guest soloist

seldom equaled.
