Rising to the defense of Hollywood, which he says is "the hardest-working, best-behaved and most misunderstood place" that he knows of, George Arliss, grand old man of both stage and screen, will speak at KFWB at 7:45 p.m. today.

This begins a series of programs, Radio Newsreel, which will feature an impressive roster of screen stars in an effort to portray accurately and entertainingly the "inside circles" of Hollywood. The series has been recorded and is being presented on 110 radio stations throughout the country.

Mr. Arliss in his talk, spiced with his particular brand of dry and sparkling humor, will fittingly introduce the new feature.

Film night is to be celebrated on the Golden State Blue Monday Jamboree over KHJ from KFRC, San Francisco, tonight. Two hours of humor, presenting "the heart-stirring, tear-compelling drama, 'Torn Between Love and Booty.'"
