America's best in tennis womanhood will compete at Forest Hills beginning today in the tilt with



Britain for the Wightman Cup. The Columbia system expects to send this tournament over KHJ at 10:45 a.m. Tennis and other outdoor-sport enthusiasts will be at the dial, and it is noted that today's competition may include the match between Helen

Wills Moody and Betty Nuthall.

Whittier takes its place in the Inter-City Radio Championship over KHJ at 7 o'clock this evening when the Whittier Women's Club promises to trundle everything from home-grown traffic bells to the vocal "life of Whittier's parties" before the microphone.

And for concerts, Columbia is to present Sophia Braslau, America's best-known native-born contralto, in the gypsy role in De Falla's "El Amor Brujo" when that work is broadcast over KHJ at 4:30 by the New York Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra. Moussorgsky's introduction to "Kovantchina" will open this pleasing half-hour.

Earlier in the day over KHJ at 1 a Jewish Art program is promised, described as "one of the most interesting and beautiful on the air." We are told the highly developed folk and religious music of the Jews brings an oriental note, the mystery of strangeness and an intense sincerity to the listener.
