A whirlpool of high lights today—welcoming the first surge when KECA throws open the doors of the Metropolitan Operahouse, bidding you attend Giuseppe Verdi's "Il Trovatore," with Rosa Ponselle in the leading role—12:30 noon is the time. A portion of the third act will be heard with Deems Taylor as narrator. Miss Ponselle will be supported by Giacomo Lauri-Volpi, Giuseppe Danise and Tancredi Pasero.

Again KHJ will swing open the operatic doors at 5:15 p.m. when a two-hour all-Wagnerian concert by the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra comes to your dial. This concert will be directed by Leopold Stokowski. Excerpts are from "Tristan" and each of the music dramas which make up "The Ring of the Nibelungs." As well as the entire Philadelphia Orchestra Stokowski will have under his baton: Elsa Alsen, soprano, and Paul Althouse, tenor, and vocalists from the Curtis Institute of Music, chosen from students who are completing their preparation for operatic careers and from the Philadelphia Grand Opera.

While today's radio high lights furnish you with a feast of varieties—lend an ear to KHJ at 1:30 this afternoon.

The pronounced popularity of the first of a series of talks on Contract Bridge made by Mrs. G. U. Purdy, a nationally known expert, on the Times Forum period last Saturday will undoubtedly be emphasized today, for Mrs. Purdy will speak again this afternoon, going more into detail on the fine points of the game. Preceding Mrs. Purdy's talk there will be a brief chat by Ransome Sutton, science writer for The Times, on why Einstein and other internationally known scientists all flock here. Mr. Sutton talks science in plain English and his explanation will undoubtedly be edifying and informative. The forum begins at 1:30 o'clock.

Spades—A. K. 6. 4. 2.
Hearts—3.
Diamonds—K. Q. J. 7. 6.
Clubs—5. 4.

Not only will Mrs. Purdy tell you what to bid with this and why, but she will tell you what your partner should do. Explanations as to the utility of this bid will be given in full and players should be given this clipping at hand.

Here is another hand:

Spades—A. J. 4. 3.
Hearts—5. 4. 3.
Diamonds—A. K. Q. 8. 7. 4.

If your partner as dealer bids one Spade and the next hand passes, what do you bid? A full explanation about this hand will be given, the reasons for the bid made and the ultimate aim will be discussed.

Other interesting information will be given each week about official contract bidding.
