on Robert Browning's poem, "The
Ring and the Book," the story of
Caponasacchi has been successful in
many literary forms.

ond act of the Wagnerian opera

tenor, that of Tristan.

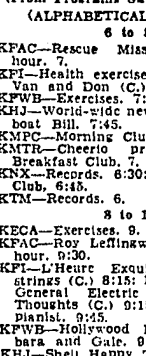
