W-G-N FEATURES

Tonight W-G-N will broadcast three portions of the Chicago and Music Festival, sponsored by the Chicago Tribune, from Soldiers' field. The first broadcast will be heard from 7:30 to 8 o'clock featuring the opening of the festival. The second will be of 13 minutes duration from 9 to 9:13, during which will be heard the juvenile band champions, Garbel's monster band and part of the community singing. The broadcast will then be interrupted for the reading of “Tomorrow's Tribune” and “Headlines of Other Days,” and will be resumed at 9:28 to continue until 10:30, with the exception of the performance of John Charles Thomas, who is the guest soloist. Thomas, owing to his contract with another broadcasting company, is unable to sing over W-G-N.
