Harold Stokes, one of the best known maestros in the United States, will make his debut as leader of the new W-G-N dance orchestra in a 45 minute program tonight at 7:30 o'clock. Featured with the 22 piece orchestra will be the Doring Sisters, harmony trio; the King's Jesters, male quartet; Arthur Wright, tenor, and Georgie Howard, Dick Teela, and Gale Page, blues singer. Special arrangements and continuity have been prepared for the show by Mr. Stokes. Another show will make its bow to W-G-N listeners at 6 o'clock this evening, when the "Air Adventures of Jimmy Allen" will be heard. The show is written and produced by two airmen and abounds in thrills. It will be heard nightly, except Saturday and Sunday, at the same hour.
