W-G-N will present the first of its Christmas carol concerts, which will be broadcast on the air for 30 minutes and over a loud speaker system on Tribune Tower between 5 and 6 o'clock tonight.

Featured on the first broadcast, which will run from 5 to 5:30, will be the Northwestern University A Capella choir, directed by Oliver S. Beltz; the W-G-N concert orchestra, directed by Henry Weber, with Chase Baromeo, operatic and concert basso, as guest soloist. Mr. Baromeo will sing the sacred song "Thus Said the Lord of Hosts" from "The Messiah." The orchestra will play some of the best known carols of Sweden and Belgium.
