

On the Air Today

A NOTHER amateur night is on! Here are details of Art Godfrey's venture, a local amateur competition whose opening night is March 30 from 6:45 to 7:15.

Definition of eligible amateurs—people who have never been paid for radio work. Minimum age is 16 years. Contestants must register on cards obtainable at WJSV, eighth floor, Earle Building, or at stores selling Southern Dairies' ice cream. These are to be filled out and returned to Arthur Godfrey, WJSV, who will notify talent of date of their appearance.

Three judges will be selected for each night. They will be newspapermen, musicians, radio officials (not directly connected with WJSV), radio artists, agency executives, etc. Judges will select their winner—the radio audience may vote for their winner, who may or may not be the selection of the judges. The judges' winner will be given one performance at the Fox Theater, the audience winner receives a paid return engagement on the amateur show two weeks from the date of first appearance.

Another main prize has not yet been decided. Also, a finalist will be selected after a designated period—also not definite—and this finalist will be given all sorts of prizes and a week's professional engagement at Loew's Fox.

The show will be held in a downtown auditorium, to be announced later, and the audiences will number from 600 to 800 people.
