Joe Cook Billed for Lead Role

Other Favorites to Be Heard in Feature

A new forty-five-minute radio carnival, "Circus Nights," makes its debut through N.B.C. and KFI at 8:30 p.m.—the spot formerly held by the Intimate Revue.

Joe Cook, circus-trained clown, is to play the barker, handyman, circus manager and water carrier to the elephants. Others on the bill are Tim and Irene, former San Francisco funsters; Phil Duey, baritone; Lucy Monroe, soprano; Peg La Centra, blues singer, and B. A. Rolfe's orchestra.

SPONSORS' TROUBLES

The sponsors thought of Cook for the starring role when they conceived the idea for the presentation. When it appeared he would not be available they made proposals to "Doc" Rockwell to fill the role of chief comic and Ted Lewis to supply the music.

It appears that Rockwell and Lewis put up such a battle over who was to get top billing that the sponsors called off the deal.

When Cook was asked to listen to recorded auditions of the program he said, "Count me in."
