Sound on cellophane is the latest wrinkle in the radio industry. According to the magazine Radio Art. The material is fireproof, non-deteriorating and strong, and occupies less space than the nitrate film that has been used for "sound-on-film" rolls.

The new material is called "Collaphilm." One of its greatest advantages is its durability, for instead of the striations being merely coated on the surface of the film, as in present-day use, it is impregnated throughout the entire thickness of the strip. If scratched, the stock may be repolished and refinished with a varnishlike substance which acts as a preservative, and the "Collaphilm" may be used again and again without the loss of definition.
