

On the Air Today

How would you like to see one of the most popular of the air shows as it goes on the air? There was a time two or three years ago when a seat was to be had for the asking. When Aunt Mathilda and Sister Susie went to New York for a few days the procedure was to pick up the tickets for the desired show a day or two in advance.

Not so today. The "radio theater" has become an entertainment institution and if you wish to see Mal. Bowes and his amateurs, for example, as they go through their hour on the air, you apply at least two weeks in advance for the coveted seats. Both networks present at least two or three radio shows a night before audiences of several hundred. It is their applause which is heard between numbers on the air.

And despite what your personal preference might be, thousands of persons who visit New York but once a year would rather see Fred Waring and his Pennsylvanians at the CBS playhouse than the best music show on Broadway. As the new fall and winter radio shows approach, with more "big names" than ever before, demands for tickets for the radio presentations are increasing. It is expected that the sponsors soon will take over distribution of these "passes" entirely. Not even the network officials will have a hand in doing them out.

Speaking of fall and winter radio fare, prospects are shaping up for the best season in the history of broadcasting. Soon the Mills Brothers, Elen Brothers, Helen Hayes, Grace Moore, Jack Benny, Kate Smith, Al Pearce and Gang, Lawrence Tibbett, Lum and Abner, Sigmund Romberg, Deems Taylor, Phil Ducey, Phil Cook, Fred Allen and several others, already established as radio favorites, will be back on your dials regularly. Eddie Cantor and Jimmie Wallington are scheduled for an opening soon. Eddie Duchin (without fire chief Wynn) it is understood will present an entirely new type of fire chief program, beginning October 1.

Their programs to have premieres within the next six weeks include the Atwater Kent Hour with its tops in serious talent; Niela Goodelle, the "one girl show," musical footnotes, rendezvous musicale and Hammerstein's Music Hall—all general music shows. The National Barn Dance has been renewed and Easy Aces becomes a night program twice a week about the first of October. Art Kessel and his orchestra will back up the Mills Brothers in their new program and a Hal Tooten sports talk comes as extra measure.

On the sustaining side of the business, N. B. C. announces: Masquerade, a daily drama; Great Mo-

ments in History, Your Child, Magic of Speech, General Federation of Women's Clubs, N. B. C. Music Appreciation Hour, Our American Schools, Music and American Youth, National Vespers and the Catholic Hour. And C. B. S. has not yet been heard from.

Tonight, Senator Nye discusses the "Kellogg Peace Pact and Neutrality." WJSV, at 10. Lud Gluskin, WJSV, at 8, presents an arrangement of popular tunes which had their origin in European countries, including "Lying in the Hay" and "When Day is Done," which

originally was titled "Madonna" in Vienna. Little Jackie Heller makes his third guest appearance in Ben Bernie's program. WRC, Fred Waring salutes the State of California in his show, WJSV, at 8:30 presenting various dance rhythms and songs which, no doubt, would not exist if California did not exist. WOL ends its Congressional Hi-Lite series with a discussion of "The Seventy-fourth Congress," by Congressman Byron N. Scott, of California. Gracie Barrie sings for N. T. G., WMAL, at 8.
