

# On The Air Today

**I**F YOU'RE interested in knowing what the country at large thinks of the re-election prospects of President Roosevelt in 1936, or what the United States as a whole thinks of governmental expenditures for relief—or numerous other vital national problems, you'll be interested, too, in hearing Dr. George Gallup tonight, WRC, at 7:30.

Dr. Gallup is managing director of the American Institute of Public Affairs. It is his organization that polls the country on these national issues and provides the cross-sections of opinion through "America Speaks," published each Sunday in The Post.

Tonight he'll tell exactly how the public pulse is scientifically felt, and why he believes he will be able to forecast, for example, the trend of the 1936 campaign. To be informed, read "America Speaks" each Sunday. And to understand thoroughly how the figures are obtained with amazing accuracy, hear Dr. Gallup tonight at WRC.

Wallace Beery set a limit of 12 appearances in the "Chateau" Saturday night shows—and consequently bows out on December 23. Of interest, however, is the return of Al Jolson as of January 4.

When Jolson left the "Chateau" series last October the reason being that his time would be entirely taken up in picture making, a tongue-in-the-cheek attitude was taken by many close to broadcasting. Similarly, pictures have not interfered with the air work of Jack Benny, Rudy Vallee and other radio personalities. It should be noted, on the other hand, that Fred Allen took a vacation from the airways last summer to make a picture. And occasionally other stars of screen and radio have dropped one temporarily to favor the other.

But a strong feeling prevailed that Jolson might not be back. That can be checked off now. He's going to be right back at the old stand as before.

According to the gentleman who handles Singin' Sam's publicity, the Hoosier air basso is scheduled to appear in Washington December 16. The publicity gentleman says he'll "do his stuff from the studio owned by a large drug store chain." Well, he can't fool us. Sam's going to sing in Arch McDonald's "goldfish bowl" over at the Peoples studio on G street.

The bosses of the Intercity net

are chuckling over the announcement that "March of Time" will revert to a once-a-week news dramatization on the old half-hour basis, in the near future. They're amused because they have been presenting "Five Star Final" for more than four years, five or six times weekly—making the feature the oldest daily news dramatization in radio. "Five Star Final" is produced by Phillip Barrison, dramatic director of New York's WJCA, key station of the Intercity net. WOL presents the feature locally, Monday's through Fridays, on a quarter-hour basis and Sundays for half an hour.

Speaking of WOL, a birthday celebration is scheduled for next Tuesday when WOL reaches the ripe and honorable old age of 11 years. One feature for the occasion stands out prominently—the announcers are to have their own way all day long. They will do what they wish, say what they care to and conduct themselves generally to suit themselves. My, my, what a golden opportunity! For one 18-hour broadcasting day the public should be able to hear programs presented without the usual studio inhibitions and triteness.

The address of Premier Mussolini before the Italian Chamber of Deputies this morning will be broadcast by WJSV, beginning approximately at 9:55 and continuing indefinitely. It comes by short-wave and will be translated from time to time. J. H. H.
