

N.B.C. String Symphony Concert Headlines Radio Musical Array for Day

Frank Black Will Conduct Presentation

Ken Murray Gets New Spot for Fun Show

The musical headliner of the day's log is the N.B.C. String Symphony concert on KECA at 6 p.m. Frank Black, conductor, has programmed Bach's "Arioso," the introduction to his cantata, "Ich Steh' Mid Einem Puss Im Grabe," "Eine Kleine Serenade," by Trunk, Von Bausnern's "Prolog," and Holst's "St. Paul Suite."

An announcement is at hand stating that Black has been engaged as guest conductor of the Cleveland Orchestra for a series of six concerts to be presented during the Great Lakes Exposition in Cleveland this summer. The first concert is to be presented July 28, and the series will continue on consecutive nights except Friday, with matinee and evening concerts August 2. It is likely that some of the programs will be broadcast.

Night-time Spot

Ken Murray, latest of the radio comedians to strike the fancy of dialers, is to present his fun show at 8:30 p.m. over Columbia and KHJ today and succeeding Tuesdays. The spot—four hours later than previous broadcasts—is a much better time for a comedy program. Phil Regan is the vocalist on the bill and Russ Morgan's orchestra dispenses the melody.

Birthday Celebration

Celebration of the third birthday anniversary of "Death Valley Days," engaging N.B.C. series, is slated on KFI at 8 p.m. When asked the reason for the popularity of the feature, the Old Ranger remarked: "I think it's because we're kept to simple fare. Nothin' fancy or artificial. Just true stories about honest-to-goodness folk of the desert."

Bernie's Guests

Bebe Daniels and Ben Lyon are to appear on Ben Bernie's N.B.C. KFI broadcast at 6 p.m. making it the third time they have been the Old Maestro's guests. Bernie and the lads will be operating on a close schedule. Bernie and all the lads arrived in Hollywood yesterday, and Mr. and Mrs. Lyon leave for New York and London tomorrow.

Edward G. Robinson, screen actor, takes the spotlight on "Parties at Plectra" (KHJ-6 p.m.) when Miss Plectra presents what she terms "Circus Night." The last broadcast of Eddie Dowling's Revue from Chicago will be heard over KFI at 6 p.m. Immediately following the broadcast the troupe will head for New York and the remainder of the series will emanate from Radio City. "Court of Human Relations" is one radio headliner that will continue through the summer months. Members of the cast have canceled vacations so the dramatic series can be kept intact. Jovett Shouse, president of the American Liberty League, speaks over KECA at 7:15 p.m. The point of origination of the address is Washington. The social relief phase of the unemployment problem in California will be discussed over KNX at 8 p.m. Patrick McGeehan, one of the leading players at the Pasadena Community Playhouse, is to have the role of a "hick" from upstate New York, in the current broadcast of Sara Langman's "Who?" on KPWB at 8 p.m. Fred Waring's special broadcast last Saturday in connection with the dedication of the Ford Rotunda was one of the most delightful contributions of the week-end.
