Today's Features

ON W-G-N.

Tonight W-G-N and the Mutual system will present two hours of entertainment from the Chicagoland Music festival at Soldiers' field. The first portion of the broadcast will be heard between 7:30 and 8:30 o'clock. Several of the winners of the competitions in the various classes will be heard, as will Chicago's Massed High School bands, the Festival chorus and Symphony orchestra and community singing. Captain Howard Stube will lead the High school bands and Henry Weber will direct the Festival orchestra. David Nyvall Jr., Homer Rodeheaver, and Oscar Anderson are to direct other portions of the first hour's show.

The second half of the broadcast, between 9 and 10 o'clock, will consist of a tribute to George Gershwin by the Festival orchestra, conducted by Mr. Weber; a Negro Cotton Picking pageant, directed by J. Wesley Jones; the winning vocalist singing "At Dawning" under the direction of the composer, Charles Wakefield Cadman; Community singing lead by Mr. Rodeheaver, and Marion Claire, singing "Make a Wish" from the picture of the same name.

Rubinoff will be presented with his violin playing "Dance of the Russian Peasants," to be followed by the Festival chorus and competing choruses singing "Hallelujah Chorus" by Handel and the singing of the "Star Spangled Banner." The broadcast will be announced by Bob Eilson.
