

# Gracie Allen's Paintings Leave Her Fans in Fog

Platoons of Gracie Allen fans arrayed themselves in massed ranks in the lobby of the Merchandise Mart to scrutinize eight of her surrealist paintings, nightmares in pastel, placed on exhibition yesterday. They gazed and gazed and over their countenances spread bewilderment, befuddlement, anger, and sadness, but no ecstasy except for one unidentified person who was heard to exclaim, "Wonderful, marvelous—but now I must be getting back to Dunning."

The pictures in which yellow, pink, and apple-green hues predominated, bore such mind-fogging titles as "Man with Mike Fright Moons Over Manicurist," "Dogs Gather on Street Corner to Watch Men Fight," "Keglined Can Sinking a Couple of Hard Putts in No Trump," "Man Builds Better Mousetrap and Bags Mohair Toupe," "Gravity Gets Body Scissors on Virtue as Night Falls Upside Down," and "Eyes Adrift as Sardines Wrench at Your Heartstrings."

The fighting picture, in which pink predominates, shows men with dogs' heads, and spectating purps with men's. And there is a lamp post wriggling like a snake, not to mention a Christmas tree over which an enormous electric light bulb [fastened to nothing] sheds a potent glow.

Fred Waring and his crew of entertainers, who have been missing from the air for almost a year, yesterday were signed for a Saturday night WMAQ-NBC series starting early in the fall. He will be sponsored by the headache remedy maker who last winter had Hugh Johnson on the air.
