10:15 A. M., WOL—Mutual begins its day at the Republican National Convention at an early hour.

11:30, WMAL—"Forest Travel for Stay-Homers," a new series of summer programs based on imaginary trips to national parks in all parts of the country inaugurates a weekly Wednesday feature of the National Farm and Home Hour.

1:15, P. M., WMAL—William Pitt, in 1775, addressed the English House of Lords on the subject of removing the British troops from Boston. Echoes of History catches a possibility of what the English upper house heard.

3:15 P. M., WOL—From Aqueduct's turf we hear the running of the Gazelle Stakes.
