3 p. m., WJSV—Arthur Sweetser, former press director of the League of Nations, gives his views on possible post-war conditions.

4, WMAL—John L. Lewis of the C. I. O. makes a Labor Day address.

4:30, WJSV—A. F. Whitney, president of the Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen, addresses the third Constitutional Convention of the United Office and Professional Workers.

5, WJSV, WOL and WBC—President Roosevelt speaks at the dedication of the Great Smokey National Park.
