2 p. m., WMAL—"The Barber of Seville," Rossini's beloved comic opera, is the selection of the Metropolitan Opera today. John Charles Thomas stars as Figaro, with the Met's new American coloratura, Josephine Tuminia, opposite him in the role of Rosina. Others in the cast are Bruno Landi, Ezio Pinza, and Salvatore Baccaloni, the new Italian basso.

4:30, WRC—The American Legion sponsors a highway safety broadcast, featuring Traffic Director Van Duzer and Miss Jane Cox, chairman of the finance committee of the District of Columbia Legion.

9:35, WMAL—For the first of four broadcasts in which he will conduct the N. B. C.
