TODAY'S RADIO HIGHLIGHTS

MARGARET TRUMAN will be interviewed by John Adams, CBS presidential reporter, tonight at 6:05 over WTOP. This recorded interview will be the first broadcast in Washington by Miss Truman since she began her singing career.

WOOK, the sunrise-to-sunset station which specializes in borrowing program ideas from the networks, has now turned to BBC for inspiration. Today at 12:30 p. m. a Washington version of the British "Brains Trust" will begin. Eric Rendle, a born and bred Britisher, who did some spasmodic broadcasting for the BBC from Singapore, is moderator.

Preliminary conversation indicates he has that it's-not-well-bred-to-be-glib manner of broad-

casting that makes British ad lib announces so difficult to take in an American environment. (Rendle is also a newscaster for WOOK.)
