C. E. HOOPER, the man who makes so many radio people unhappy, will be interviewed tonight at 9 over WTOP-CBS. Originator and operator of the Hooperating system of estimating a program's listener appeal by making telephone surveys during the broadcast, Hooper is a household word in radio. Appearing with him will be Arthur Godfrey, WTOP-CBS morning man and emcee of "The Talent Scouts" program, who is one of the few radio performers able to look Hooper in the eye unblushingly.
