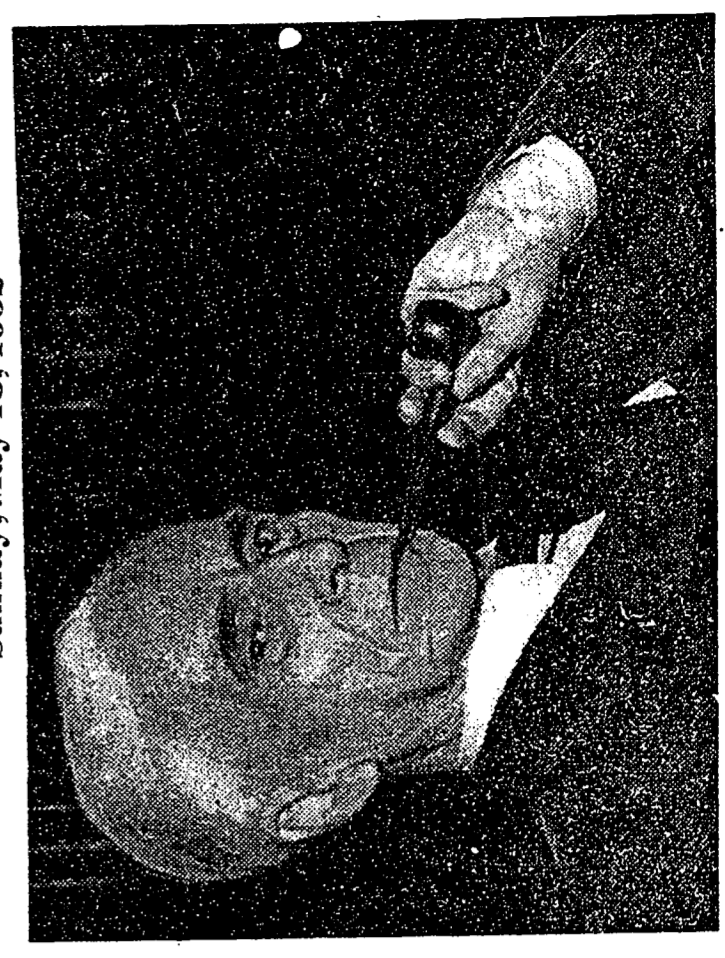

Sunday Radio Highlights

COMMENTATOR JOSEPH C. HARSCH, named last night as winner of the Alfred I. Dupont Foundation Award for news reporting for 1951, begins a new series of news commentaries on WOL tonight at 6 p. m. This series was originally scheduled to start last week but Harsch's tape recording, flown from Paris (where he was covering Eisenhower's final tour of NATO in stations), got tied up in red tape at customs.

The Dupont award went to Harsch for his "consistently excellent and accurate gathering and reporting of news by radio," last year in a series heard on WOL and the Liberty network. Coincidentally, Liberty announced Thursday that it would cease to function as of that night.
