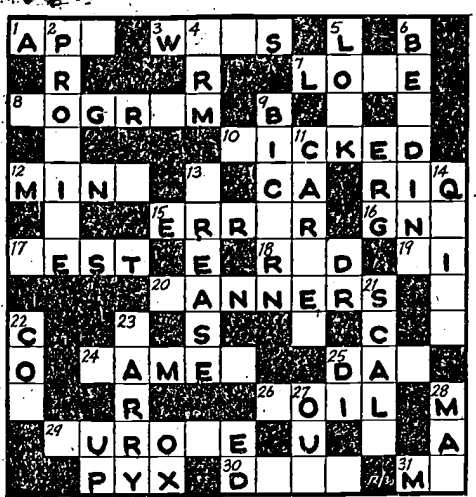

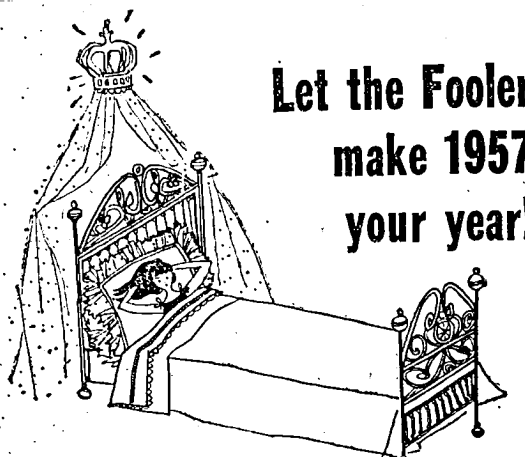

The Rules
