VEN AS YOU READ, Ed Sullivan and an outstanding troupe of American vaudeville artists are putting on a two-hour show six nights a week, plus two matinees, for the Russians at the Moscow Trades Fair. No slouches at vaudeville themselves, the Russians are finding out how good our fellows are at plate-spinning, tightrope walking, tap and snake dancing, and extracting lighted electric bulbs from their mouths.

It seems that Sullivan has the Russians -in the words of an old American proverb-eating out of his hand. A cable from him just the other day said "Show terrific! Played to 22,000!" While this sounded fine, we were a little surprised at his enthusiasm since on an average Sunday night Sullivan plays to 30 million people in 11 million U.S. homes over the CBS Television Network. To be sure Sullivan wasn't on television, but if he were, we're sure most of the 2½ million USSR television homes would be tuning him in. Nevertheless, his success as a representative American citizen should please the U.S. State Department (under whose auspices he's making his strawhat tour of the steppes) as much as it pleases us. Any day now he's due down south in Odessa and Tiflis where we have no doubt he'll be wowing them, too. Billed as Sullivan's Travels, a 90-minute account of his experiences will appear on your screen on Sunday, September 27.

When we asked our Economic Advisor why the last few months have been such banner months for television set sales (one-third greater than in 1958) he told us some interesting facts. He said it could be attributed partly to the growing popularity of the new portable and slim-type sets, partly to the fact that set prices have come down tremendously through the years, but mainly to the fact that more people were buying extra sets. For example, in 1955 barely over 1 million homes had two sets; today nearly 41/2 million television homes, or roughly 1 out of every 10, have two sets. And if you want to run it down even further, 407,000 homes have three sets! The wav things are going it looks as if people soon won't be able to give television enough houseroom.
