

You could have had all of it in your living room by watching the first two special news programs Thursday and Sunday night on the CBS Television Network.

owever, if you ACT NOW! there's still a lot left to see. This Thursday at 7:30 pm, EDT, you can tune in the President in Paris with General de Gaulle. There'll be a glittering parade down the Champs Elysees ending up at the Arc de Triomphe and followed by one of those fabulous State Dinners that only the French can throw together, attended by leaders of Government in their breastplates and diagonal sashes. In addition, there'll be the official conferences, all vividly described and analyzed by an on-thescene team of CBS News correspondents who are covering the President's trip in pursuit of peace. Finally, next Sunday at 7:30 pm, EDT, you can see a complete review of the entire expedition as well as an informed interpretation of its political significance.

Meanwhile, back at the ranch, the new Fall entertainment season will have got underway as the nation's favorite Westerns start their new series on the Network - tonight, for example, The Texan at 8 pm, EDT, and next Saturday the premieres of Wanted: Dead or Alive (8:30 pm) and the most famous of them all, Gunsmoke, at 10.
