AN OPEN LETTER TO TV VIEWERS

Last Tuesday, a new comedy-variety series called "Everything Goes" premiered on Channel 7. Following are television critics' reviews: "Everything Goes" is the title of the new 11:15 p.m. to 12:15 a.m. skandies offered on Ch. 7 last night for the first time. It stars several mustered-out members of the old Bilko gang (Maurice Gosfield, Harvey Lembeck) plus Dayton Allen and Allen Melvin. The format seems an outright and somewhat crude imitation of Jack Paar's TV sloping; Harvey Lembeck is the man behind the desk and commercials; the rest sit nearby on a couch. "Lembeck is a good performer with a script, but lacks the dominating personality or polish necessary to make this sort of show important. Dayton Allen, essentially a mimic, used his Groucho Marx imitation constantly through most of the premiere, attempting to duplicate Groucho's impudent freshness, which in less formidable talents comes out not as freshness, only as gall. Maurice Gosfield, the big fat fellow of Phil Silver's troupe, also lacks something once he's removed from a script. Allen Melvin perhaps promised his mother he'd be funny, apparently not under oath." -JACK O'BRIAN New York Journal-American Wed., Sept. 30, 1959 "Allen Melvin, Maurice Gosfield and Harvey Lembeck, who campaigned under Sgt. Bilko and Dayton Allen, a mimic of Steve Allen joined forces for "Everything Goes," a nightly catchall (11:15-12:15) on WABC-TV. The first show was a shambles.
