Football will be featured on W-G-N this afternoon, when Quin Ryan will broadcast the Michigan-Chicago game from Stagg field. The broadcast will start at 1:45 o'clock, fifteen minutes before game time.

At 9:07 p. m. on "Headlines of Other Days," W-G-N will present Fred Aubert, a member of the crew of the dirigible America, one of the first lighter than air craft to attempt a trans-Atlantic flight. A balloon captained by Walter Wellman and a crew of five men. The flight was made in October, 1910. Bob Elson will give the newspaper version and Mr. Aubert, an eye-witness, an account of the trip, which ended in disaster.
