Sacred music associated with the Christmas season will be heard on two W-G-N programs today. At 5 o'clock the Christmas carol concert will be aired for 30 minutes and will be carried on the Tribune Tower speaker system for an hour. Eleanor La Mance, operatic soprano, will sing "The First Noel," and the choir of Emanuel church of La Grange, Myron Boehm directing, will sing six songs. At 7:30 o'clock the Paulist choristers will present a half hour program under the direction of Father Eugene F. O'Malley. The numbers: "Silent Night," "Adeste Fidelis," "Three Kings," "Good King Wenceslaus," "Angels and Shepherds," "Virgin's Cradle Song," and "The Holly and the Ivy."

Ceremonies in connection with the lighting of the community Christmas tree in Lafayette square at Washington, at which President Roosevelt will speak briefly, will be broadcast at 4 p. m. by W-G-N. [Also on WENR and WIND.]
