W-G-N will present short talks by two famous Scouts, Lord Robert Baden-Powell, organizer of the Boy Scout movement, and Walter W. Head, president of the Boy Scouts of America, in a program at 8:15 tonight.

Lord Baden-Powell will be heard from Toronto, Ont., and Mr. Head from Chicago. The broadcast will be carried over the Mutual Broadcasting system and the Canadian Radio commission network.

This is the first time the MBS and the Canadian commission have united for a single broadcast.

Sara Levee, concert pianist, will be soloist with the W-G-N concert orchestra, directed by Henry Weber, on the "Symphonette" at 9:15 tonight. Miss Levee will play Beethoven's "First Movement" from his concerto in G major. Edward Vito, harpist, will play Hasselmann's "Valse de Concert."
