After yesterday's splurge of high lights, today on radio will seem comparatively uneventful but you'll find plenty of entertainment for a rainy day.

At the wrong end of a "perfect day"—Shell Happytime (KFI at 8 a.m.) presents as its guest artist Carrie Jacobs Bond, who should charm you with several of her favorite compositions. Mystery and superstition is supposed to run rampant through the balance of this program. "Shoo the Hoodoo Away" is a number in character. Columbia sends two fifteen-minute New York classics, Dan Borzage (KHJ at 11) and the Columbia Artists' Recital (KHJ, 11:15) and if you want to know how to run a hotel, the American School of the Air (KHJ at 11:30) brings Thomas D. Green, president of the American Hotel Association.

If "the play's the thing"—N.B.C.'s Radio Guild (KECA at 1 p.m.) features Margaret Wycherley and Ernest Cossart, Broadway stars, in a presentation of St. John Ervine's "Jane Clegg." At 6:30 p.m. over KHJ another interesting chapter of the Memoirs of Gen. Pershing, his visit to the King and Queen of Belgium. It treats in a dramatization of the darkest hour of the war for the Allies. Then at 10 p.m. KTM romps out into the calcium with "Asking Father," a one-act comedy by Robert Almes.

For sports, baseball is represented by Rogers Hornsby in an interview (KFWB at 9 p.m.) while KNX at 9:45 takes you to the Hollywood Legion for the fracas between Young Papke and Don Smith, lightweights.
