Tibbett will be accompanied by
the Simmons Symphony Orchestra
under the direction of Wilfred Peli-
tier.

the Blue Monday Jamboree—KHJ

ning, heralded with a ringing of
cowbells and an imposing medley of
animal noises. The Deep Dramatic
