

RADIO TO KEEP SPIRIT OF DAY

Patriotic Programs of Four Large Cities Scheduled

Hurley, Hyde, Doak, Rogers and Ritchie Will Speak

Uzoudun-Baer Battle to Be Transmitted From Reno

The Times Forum—canceled to permit the broadcasting of the national open golf championships. World - Wide News, 7 a.m., 12:30, 5:20 and 10 p.m.

Radio booms out over the ether waves in a salute to Independence Day, bringing to the West programs originating in four of the nation's large cities, Philadelphia, Chicago, Washington and Baltimore.

And if you arise in time, you may tune in on KFT's attempt to pick up and rebroadcast from Tokio.

Japan, at 4 a.m. Swinging into the spirit of the day KHJ at 7:15 o'clock this morning will bring the complete program of exercises at Independence Hall, Philadelphia. Originally it had been planned to transmit only the address of Secretary of War Hurley at the ceremonies. The schedule at Philadelphia now includes the reading of the Declaration of Independence, the pledge to the flag and patriotic music by the Philadelphia Police Band and by a vocal chorus. From Chicago, over KHJ at 9 o'clock, will be heard an address by Secretary of Agriculture Hyde, with martial selections by the

R.O.T.C. Service Band: This will be a full hour feature, not yet programmed but certain to be replete with patriotic music and song.

At approximately 12:15 p.m. round-by-round reports will be given by direct wire from Reno, over KHJ, on the battle between Paulino Uzoudun and Max Baer. "Doug" Douglas and Frank Roche will bring the battle to you, with supplementary ring-side observations by Harry Carr. Be there at the knockout—the boys are going to stay in the squared circle until somebody drops.

After ten has been counted over one of the Reno contenders, both KHJ and KECA will follow the little white ball in the national open golf championships. KHJ schedules this broadcast for 1:45 and KECA for 2:30 p.m.

KHJ at 4:30 will offer an address by Assistant Secretary of State Rogers. This is to come to the West over the Columbia system, direct from Washington.

Two more periods that will hold your dial are on the KHJ schedule, the first at 5:30 p.m., when Secretary of Labor Doak will speak on the significance of Independence Day. Again at 7:45 p.m. Columbia cuts into Baltimore, where Gov. Ritchie will speak from Patterson Park, Baltimore. A crowd of 200,000 is expected to assemble there in celebration of Independence Day.

And for the rest, consult the high lights.
