

# H. G. WELLS TOPS BROADCAST LIST

*Talk on Russia Scheduled Over London Hook-up*

*Marion Talley Also Billed After Long Retirement*

*Blue Monday Jamboree Still Another of Features*

H. G. Wells, Marion Talley and the Blue Monday Jamboree top the radio schedule for today, and should help to chase the blues away.

"Russia in the Melting Pot," as told from London by H. G. Wells, will be heard over KHJ at 12:20 p.m. In 1920, after a personal tour of the land of the soviet, Wells published "Russia in the Shadows," and he has kept in close touch with developments in that country ever since. He is regarded as the foremost living writer on the past, present and future history of the world.

Emerging from a retirement of two years, Marion Talley, former Metropolitan Opera Company soprano, will be heard

on the N.B.C. network and through KFI at 6:30 o'clock tonight, in a special program. She will open her share of the bill with the aria, "Je Suis Titania" from "Mignon," by Thomas. Her next selection is to be the old Scotch melody, "Comin' Thru' the Rye." The

prima donna's brief return to public life will be concluded, as she sings a light concert piece, "Sing On," a waltz number by Denza, and "No Night There," a hymn by Danks.

If the intellectuals and sopranos lack appeal, turn your dial to KHJ at 8 tonight. At that moment KFRC, the Don Lee station at San Francisco, will turn its Blue Monday Jamboreecadadors loose. The Deep Dramatic Stock Company will present "Bungle Land," an original musical comedy featured by new tunes and jokes. It is to be oriental night on the Jamboree, which means that everything from a Chinese funeral to a Turkish harem will be included. Two hours of nonsensical agony are scheduled, to make you forget the humidity.
