Payne's Orchestra on Bill From Studios Overseas

Aggregation Favorite With Listeners-in-Abroad

Tonight's Concert Offerings Promise Rare Treats

This afternoon you can dance to the strains of Jack Payne's British Broadcasting Orchestra, coming from overseas. And in the array of good music scheduled for this evening there are at least three concerts radio lovers will not miss.

The National Broadcasting Company, through KECA at 1:25 o'clock this afternoon, is to offer thirty minutes of dance music as interpreted by English musicians, originating in the studios of the British Broadcasting Corporation in London. Payne's orchestra is one of the foremost in Britain—and you will be interested in knowing what the British radio public likes.

Glancing through the evening programs, the New York Philharmonic Symphony, over KHJ at 6 o'clock, bids for the palm. Fritz Reiner is to direct the organization in the works of Italy's greatest living composer, Ralph Ercole, tenor; will be the guest soloist. Alfred Casella, remembered as guest conductor at Hollywood Bowl several years ago, is represented on the half-hour by his ballet "La Giara." Liszt's symphonic poem, "Les Preludes" will complete the concert.

Music, "the language of the emotions" will demonstrate the truth of its claim to that title in the concert of "varying moods" to be played during the 199th Standard Symphony Hour coming to you over KFI at 7:30 tonight. Michel Piastro will conduct. Included in the program will be the classic "Ruy Blas" overture by Menhelssohn, and the celebrated Minuet of Beethoven, as well as the modern Symphony in G Minor by the little-known Russian composer, Vassili Kalinnikov.

The thousands of listeners who dial the Inglewood Park concerts are scheduled for another treat tonight over KHJ at 8:30. Frederick Stark will direct this excellent concert orchestra in a program restricted to music of the British Isles and the Colonies.

And for a song recital what could be better than a program by John Charles Thomas, leading American baritone, who is scheduled by KECA for 5:30. He will sing stirring, sentimental "Tommy Lad," and the romantic "Rose Marie" from Friml's operetta. His other numbers will be "Yeoman's Wedding," "When I Think Upon the Maidens" and "Mah-Lindy-Lou." Don Voorhees's orchestra will open with "Star Dust."
