Two Excellent Programs
Top Broadcast Schedule

New York's Philharmonic
Billed by Station KHJ

Standard Symphony to Give
Two Hundredth Concert

There's music on the air for certain tonight—a world of it under the baton of Hans Lange, directing the New York Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra, and another delightful hour with the Standard Symphony Orchestra, its two-hundredth concert over the N.B.C. network.

Twice, the first period at 5:30 o'clock, and then after a fifteen-minute local break, again at 6 over KHJ, Lange is to lead the New York Philharmonic in a concert at the Lewisohn Stadium.

Two excerpts will be presented from George W. Chadwick's "Symphonic Sketches." This will be a memorial concert for the composer, who died last year.

"Waltz Pastorale," a symphonic work, is to be directed by the composer, Allen B. Langley.

The balance of the program also will be devoted exclusively to American composers—and you can top it off at 6:30 with a quarter of an hour embracing Columbia's New World Symphony and Barbara Maurer. Barbara is to sing "Neath the Southern Moon" from "Naughty Marietta," and Rondo Gavotte from "Mignon."

When Mishel Piastro leads the Standard Symphony Orchestra in the first of the evening's repertoire, over KFI at 7:30, you will be attending the two hundredth Symphony Hour, a celebration signifying the completion of four years of continuous broadcasting. Each Thursday for the past four years the Standard Oil Company of California has sponsored this excellent hour and during the past few weeks has broadcast an invitation to all listeners to submit requests for numbers to be played during tonight's anniversary hour. The selections, from the thousands of requests submitted, follow:

"Ride of the Valkyries," Wagner; "Minuet in G," Beethoven; "A Midsummer Night's Dream," Scherzo, Mendelssohn; violin solos by Mishel Piastro; "Ave Maria," Schubert, and "Gypsy Airs," Sarasate; "The Nutcracker Suite," Tchaikowsky; "Bolero," Ravel.

If you like music—good music—here you are.
