Breaking into the evening can you imagine greater latitude than the choice between Capt. Frank Hawks, America's speed ace, and the Columbia Broadcasting System's "Nit Wits?" And that's not the half of it.

Ham and eggs and coffee will be spread before a group at the Breakfast Club, including Eddie Brandstatter and His Embassy Roof Show, with blurbs like this, "Howard Grayson and His Sensational Band," June Knight, Paramount singing star; Ruth Gillette, musical comedy star; Gordon Smith and Georgie Hickman, and speakers ranging from Dr. Bruce Baxter to Col. John A. Barry of the United States Cavalry. All on KFWB at 8 this morning.

That's radio with sun-up. Now with sundown: KHJ at 6 tonight points to Frances Williams, musical comedy star, who will make it a tale of two cities when she sings "Philadelphia;" Freddie Rich and his thirty-five-piece orchestra, a host of hits, including "Love for Sale" and "Where Have You Been?"
