"As many as you have fingers on one hand" might express what Thursday evening's total of preferred high lights appears to be. Primarily a night of music, it opens with a concert by the New York Philharmonic Orchestra; another by the Standard Symphony Orchestra; fifteen minutes with Barbara Maurel, operatic and concert contralto; a song recital by John Charles Thomas internationally famous American baritone and another Inglewood Park concert, presenting a program of Viennese operettas.

KHJ at 5:30 offers the New York Philharmonic Symphony, under the direction of Albert Coates, famous Anglo-Russian conductor. There has been much discussion since Ralph Vaughan Williams's "London Symphony" was first performed as to whether the work should be regarded as program music. This symphony will be the only work performed during the broadcast. The little motifs used to characterize London scenes, i.e., the Westminster chimes; the cry of the lavender seller, and the jingle of bells on a hansom cab should intrigue you.

At the same hour over KECA John Charles Thomas recalls the days when he first won great success as a musical-comedy star, singing "Will You Remember" from Romberg's "Maytime," Cadman's song "From the Land of the Sky Blue Water" and the appealing ballad "In the Gloaming."

At 6:30, 7:30 and 8:30 you find in that order Barbara Maurel, the Standard Symphony Hour and the Inglewood Park concert. Three of a kind well worth the music lover's dial.
