KHJ has abandoned its Halle-  
lujah Hour as such at 8 each  
morning but they've broken out in  
something titled "Sunny Side Up;"  
then you have the Hollywood Hill  
Billies over KMTR. Shell Happy  
Time over KFI and an organ  
recital from the National Broad-  
casting studios at 11 a.m. through  
KECA.

Breezing into the evening hours,  
two concerts that should prove out-  
standing are KFI's Standard Sym-  
phony Hour at 7:30 and KHJ's In-  
glewood Park concert at 8:30.

Mishel Piastro will conduct the  
Standard Symphony tonight and it  
is to mark his farewell concert as  
conductor of this symphony hour.  
Piastro is leaving shortly to become  
concert-master of the New York  
Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra  
and has endeared himself to thou-  
sands of radio listeners.

Frederick Stark, director of the  
Inglewood concert over KHJ, is  
dedicating the half-hour to "the  
spirit of the Fiesta de Los Angeles;"  
Spanish melodies and a tribute to  
modern industry signalized by de-  
voting the last fifteen minutes of  
the broadcast to the sounding of  
shrill factory whistles. For a grand  
finale, a new song from the pen of  
Charles Wakefield Cadman to the  
lyric written by Edward Lynn of  
the KHJ staff, "The Song of Steel,"  
sung by John Warnne, baritone,  
and the full ensemble.

And if Bing Crosby gets over his  
laryngitis by 7 tonight, Columbia  
will speed him along with fifteen  
minutes of love ballads.
