Celebrating the season of the
Rosh Hashana, the Imperial Male

KFAC at 8:30 p.m. "Salamaleikum"
is derived from the ancient Hebrew
greeting, "A good week to you, and
is a theme full of the splendor of
the East.

The other selections are equally
rich in historical and romantic in-
terest. Members of the quartet are
Neil Russell, baritone, of Edinburgh;
Glen Rabe, first tenor; Fred Simp-
son, second tenor, and Sherwood
Walgamott, bass. Continuity is by
