"Every dog has his day."

The bay of the Lone Wolf has gone forth into the night of the ether wave announcing a dog carnival to be held at Loyola Stadium, the 25th inst., at 2 p.m.

We recall a radio invitation over KHJ to a barbecue at La Jolla Lodge, in San Francisquito Creek, ninety miles from Los Angeles, which was responded to by 60,000 people.

There will be plenty of bones and water for the bow-wows, and it is hoped that the dog carnival will assemble the greatest pack of canines ever witnessed in one spot in the West. The theme of the event is "The Boy and His Dog," an exemplification of the love of this animal which has come down through the ages. Bench shows have their clientele where canine aristocracy reigns supreme but this carnival, while barring none, is particularly for that playfellow of boyhood known as "the purp." The dog who faithfully watched his juvenile master as the boy learned to paddle in the old swimming hole, who guarded him in his ramblings through the hills and slept at the door sill when the long day of work and play came to an end in peaceful slumber.

One hundred and one prizes are to be offered at this dog carnival but the grand prize will go to "the homeliest purp." The biggest dog, the smallest dog, the one with the best tricks and with the most humorous costume, and many, many others will receive their prizes—but this is to be an event where the homeliest dog will have his day.

The power of a radio station in reaching the public will be on trial promulgating the dog carnival, which is being fostered by a home industry, the Coast Fishing Company, of Wilmington, which is using this means of introducing a new dog and cat food, known as Balto.

The carnival is being preceded by a series of programs over KHJ, the Don Lee station, Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays at 5:45 p.m. While only two programs already have been presented, from the number of applications that have been mailed and telephoned to KHJ—there can be little question of the enthusiasm of the boy and his dog for the bow-wow pow wow. The writer has proven his love of children and all things of nature, particularly the faithful dog, and is to serve as master of ceremonies at the carnival, which incidentally is absolutely free to all and has no strings tied to it.

I hope to see so many dogs and lovers of dogs at Loyola Field, two weeks from yesterday, that a lasting evidence will be established of local loyalty to the animal.

After having broadcast for several consecutive years the annual appeal of Be Kind to Animals Week, the verdict is "Let's go, and find out how much the public really cares."
