Just before the time set for his voice to span the Atlantic N. B.C. will offer songs by a massed chorus of 2700 voices—a rally at Washington of the Girl Reserves of the Young Women's Christian Association. The United States Army Band is to greet the girls, too.

Good programs tumble over one another for tonight with Coach Howard Jones, Belle Baker, concerts, plays and what-have-you passing in parade.

At 1:20 o'clock this afternoon KFI schedules Aga Khan, a Prince of India reputed to be the wealthiest man in the world. His address will conclude the series, "What I Would Do With the World." If he does not appear this time we'd like to tell him what we'd like to do with him.

Just twenty minutes before his appearance KFI at 1 is to receive from the Central High School auditorium at Washington the ceremonies commemorating the fiftieth birthday of the "Little Girls' Y. W. G.A.," formed in Oakland in 1881. Featured on this program will be Mrs. William De Witt Mitchell, wife of the United States Attorney-General, while the Army Band will open and conclude the broadcast, also furnishing the accompaniment for the massed chorus and the Girl Reserves' Glee Club.

For those who like concert broadcasts we've a host of excellent hours. If you've "gone football," Braven Dyer is going to try to persuade Coach Howard Jones to tell you a bit about the coming game over KHJ at 7 p.m.
