"The purposes of these programs," says Rabbi Winkler, "are the dissemination of the lofty ideals of our Torah and the promotion of good will between men and men. It is my object to bring solace, comfort and consolation to those who are ailing, or who for other reasons are precluded from attending upon public worship." Mayor Porter will preside at the opening—KNX at 5:15 this afternoon. It is nonsectarian and has received the indorsement of religious leaders of all denominations.
