Hoover Talk at Dedication Slated for Broadcast

Curtis to Be Honor Guest at Breakfast Club Fete

Shortridge Will Be Speaker at Latter Gathering

Thirteen years ago today cannonading celebrated the declaration of the Armistice. Today radio booms out throughout the world in celebration of the thirteenth anniversary, substituting entertainment for the roar of shells.

Vying with each other at 8 o'clock this morning, both KFWB and KHJ will swing into the parade.

At the Los Angeles Breakfast Club vice-president Curtis and his sister, Mrs. Edward (Dolly) Gann, will be honor guests, as well as the men of the Army and Navy Legion of Valor, Admiral R. H. Leigh, commander of the United States Battle Force, and staff, and Gov. Rolph. Senator Shortridge will give a six-minute address. In addition there will be plenty of entertainment.

If you dial KHJ at 8 President Hoover will be heard during the ceremonies in connection with the dedication of the District of Columbia war memorial. Frank B. Noyes, chairman of the committee appointed by Congress to arrange for the memorial, is to present it to the nation and the President will deliver a brief address of acceptance. John Philip Sousa will direct the United States Marine Band in musical numbers. Gen. Pershing and Admiral Sims are to be present.

For noon KFI points to a salute from abroad, an Armistice Day concert from the Royal Albert Hall in London, given under auspices of the British Legion. Flashing across the Atlantic by short-wave transmission, the National Broadcasting System will pick it up for rebroadcast in this country.

"A Day in Heaven"—the title of a drama of war and peacetime, on KFWB's program for 9 p.m. It tells the story of Bill Jennings, the second of three sons drawn into the World War.
