and varieties, interlarded with a
talk from overseas and a grand
Christmas party to be given by the
Blue Monday Jamboreadors.

To start the morning right—why
not tune in on KHJ at 9:30 o'clock
for a little soft music from the Co-
lumbia system. This will be a
half-hour presentation. Emery
Deutsch and his gypsy ensemble
are to include in their program of
Viennese melodies the "Gypsy Love
Song" and "Gypsy Valse," both by
Woodin, and Brahms's "Hungarian
Rhapsodie No. 1."

A voice you will want to hear,
that of Viscount Cecil of Chelwood,
Britain's most prominent advocate
of disarmament and world peace,
crosses the Atlantic today and will
be heard over KHJ at 1:20 p.m. His
subject is a timely one—"The World
and the League." Viscount Cecil
will speak from London.

If you've a bit of fondness for
the fantastic—for Christmas music
—why not try the Children's Hour
over KHJ at 5:30. Many of the
little stars of radio's yesteryear are
to return, including David Durand,
"the little blue boy;" "Sunny Jane"
Hughes, Baby Alice Raetz, Jackie
