A trip to the Little Red Schoolhouse of the American School of the Air where we'll traipse through foreign lands, a luncheon hour tidbit with the Metropolitan Symphony, an after-dinner concert from KPFC and then we'll climb aboard an ark of music to float down the Mississippi to pay tribute to the birthday of Robert E. Lee. These are only a few of the good things flowing above your roof top today.

When Mme. Pirie-Beyea, well-known world traveler and lecturer assumes her seat in the classroom of the American School of the Air (KHJ at 11:30 a.m.) big and little youngsters will strain their ears to listen to a comparison of the countries of Central Europe as they are today, with their situation before the World War. If you oldsters closed your geographies before 1917, better brush up on what Willie has to wrestle with at school today.

Both KHJ and KNX release a gift of music from the north. KPFC promises "speed, pep, snap, go" as the order of the day. Meredith Wilson's Orchestra greets us with "Fandango"—a Spanish Caprice by Rimsky-Korsakoff, and the "Grand March" from "Aida." That's rolling in at 7:30, just after supper time.

For the concert of the evening, "A tonic journey down the Mississippi" and then the works of Stephen Foster, in "a radio tribute to the hero of the Confederacy—Robert E. Lee." The Inglewood Park Concert with Frederick Stark, conductor, points to this over KHJ at 8:45 tonight.

The Times Forum this afternoon is taken over by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, which announces that the Patrick & Marsh orchestra will furnish the musical numbers.

The usual Times series will be resumed tomorrow at the regular hour, 1:30 p.m., when Dr. Frank McCoy will give a health talk, and Edwin Schallert of the Times drama staff will be heard.
