First up is a half-hour with the New York Philharmonic Symphony Orchestra (KHJ at 8:30.) A concert for children under the baton of Ernest Schelling. This should be welcome to oldsters as well, as it opens with the overture to Weber's fairy opera, "Oberon." Saul Goodman, solo timpanist of the orchestra, is featured in several numbers.

## GANGSTERS—THEIR REMEDY

Between street corner barrages in and about the city of New York Atty.-Gen. Bennett of New York States speaks on "Gangsters—Their Remedy." (KHJ at 11:30.)

After leaving the ballroom with a remedy for gangsters step into the Metropolitan Operahouse, where the listener will hear in part one of Wagner's great music dramas, the second act of "Die Walkure." The cast includes Lauritz Melchior, tenor, in the role of Siegmund; Gertrude Kappel as Sieglinde, and a new soprano, Gota Ljungberg, as Bruennhilde. Artur Bodanzky conducts. This opera comes over KFI at noon.

## CARIDEO TO SPEAK

Looking back into the pioneer days of radio entertainment KHJ at 5:45 points to a Columbia special commemorating those early times. Vaughan De Leath, singing in New York, and Dr. Lee De Forest, speaking from California, will participate in a radio reunion. Vaughan is a pioneer singer of radio and will sing an old-fashioned melody in an old-fashioned manner before an old-fashioned microphone. The inventor will speak from the studio of KHJ, Los Angeles.

The Times Forum this afternoon (KHJ at 1:30 o'clock) will again offer a bridge talk by Mrs. G. U. Purdy, whose explanations of the contract game have been so delightful a Saturday afternoon feature. Mrs. Purdy will explain some difficult plays and will supply, without charge, printed slips of her problems to all who send in stamped and addressed envelopes to the bridge editor of the Los Angeles Times. Also Frank Carideo, for two years the star all-American quarterback of Notre Dame's unconquerable football teams of 1929-1930, will give his ideas of football today and why U.S.C. won the championship last year.
